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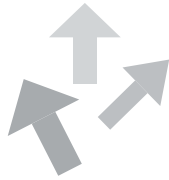
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Preface

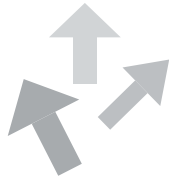

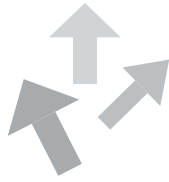
I was out of bed, pacing.

Lina’s Career Selection

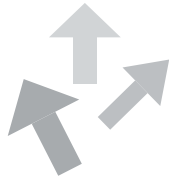

3 Historical Context Of Sacrifice

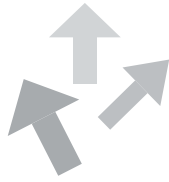

4 The Personal Impact Of Sacrifice

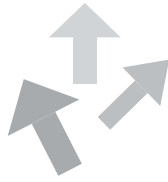
